I am delighted to say that the start of the academic year has got off to a flyer at Bright Futures Teaching School Hubs. As you know we are part of a network of 87 centres of excellence around the country, the Teaching School Hubs play an important role in the continued work underway at a national level to invest in teacher and leadership development, and we are committed to ensuring that we work with schools in our designated areas to continually support teachers and leaders with this investment.

We are delighted that we have launched our Early Career Framework work and we have over 500 ECTs working with us this autumn which is fantastic! Of course, we have some wonderful Mentors too and despite one or two challenges with the DfE portal and online systems things are very much on track.

Our National Professional Qualification recruitment has gone brilliantly too with just under 400 NPQ Programme members on board for a November start and we have recruitment plans in place for cohorts to start in February. We were thrilled with the DfEs most recent NPQ announcement to change the NPQ scholarship eligibility, now all teachers and leaders employed in a state-funded school, college or 6th form can access a fully funded NPQ programme, further details on how to apply are available below.

It has been an absolute pleasure to spend these early weeks this academic year meeting with our Local Authority colleagues, as well as taking the time to review the feedback so far from our progress to date.

You may have already seen the new EEF report on teacher professional development. The report has now been published here, along with a suite of useful resources for schools. You can also read a great overview from Roger Higgins, Director of the Julian Teaching School Hub and Norwich Research School here.

Finally, I would like to say thank you for the warm welcome our schools have given our newest members of our Teaching School Hubs Team and I know you will be as thrilled as we are with our new website bringing you all the information you need in one easy place.



National Professional Qualification

We're delighted to share with you the DfE has announced a change to the NPQ scholarship eligibility. The DfE has confirmed all teachers and leaders employed in state-funded schools, colleges and 6th forms will be able to access a fully funded NPQ programme.

Our NPQ application window is remaining open for applications to the new NPQs until Wednesday 20th October this is to allow colleagues the opportunity to access a fully funded NPQ starting in November. Once an application form has been submitted to us, colleagues will be directed to access the DfE NPQ Online Service in order to complete the registration process, this must be completed by the applicant by the 31st October or the applicant will be unable to join a November cohort.

We expect NPQ scholarships to continue for 2021/2022 and we have plans in place for NPQs starting in February 2022.
